Online Course for Judges – Target Archery

Background

World Archery have set up a dedicated learning platform that enables the initial training of judges through an online course.

The course is designed to introduce judges to the basic rules for Target Archery, which would then be supplemented by attendance at a seminar to extend the learning and put it into practice.

Although the course is designed for international judge training, national federations are free to use the course as well while keeping in mind that any differences in national rules will not be covered in the online course.

Course Contents

The course currently covers Target Archery only. It has a total of five (5) modules, with a number of units per module, covering the following subjects:

Module	Units
1. Venue and field of play inspections	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Layout b) Safety c) Measurements & tolerances for the venue and equipment d) Timing equipment e) Miscellaneous equipment
2. Athlete equipment and inspection	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Recurve b) Compound c) Conducting equipment inspection
3. Competition and shooting times and limits	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Classes and divisions b) Competition structure, including distances and number of arrows shot c) Shooting time limit and structure d) Practice times e) Shooting
4. Scoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) General principles of scoring, athlete requirements and Judge procedures b) Indoor scoring – multiple spot faces c) Compound and recurve team scoring – outdoors and indoors d) Scoring results and tie breaks
5. Penalties, disputes and appeals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) General overview of penalties b) Warnings c) Shooting and scoring penalties d) Team round scoring and time penalties e) Disputes and appeals processes

Who can have access to the course?

1. All judges who register to attend an International Judge (IJ) or Youth International Judge (YJ) Seminar will have to undertake the online course and pass the final test as part of the eligibility process for a course.
2. All IJ/IJc's and YJ's must undertake the course as part of the ongoing reaccreditation cycle.
3. Continental Associations may arrange for judges who are to attend Continental Judge Seminars to undertake the course prior to attending the seminar.
4. Member Associations may arrange for judges to undertake the course as part of their training judge education.

How is access arranged?

In order to arrange access, the Member Association of the judge(s) concerned need to request access codes. Link to request for codes is available in Extranet. The codes will be provided to federation by email within two (2) weeks. No codes will be provided to individuals contacting World Archery office.

What is the charge?

There is a charge for each access, depending on the number of access codes requested:

1-19 codes:	15 CHF/each
20-99 codes:	12 CHF/each
100+ codes:	10 CHF/each

Each Member Association will be charged at the end of the year, unless requested differently.

What will happen after access code is provided?

Each code can be used by one person and is valid for one year. The Member Association is responsible for managing the codes that were provided to them.

The participant will need to go to <https://education.worldarchery.org> and will need to provide personal details with the first log-in. The code is needed to enrol to course.

Does passing online course give participants a certification?

No, but passing online course might be one of the requirements for certain certification.
