



## WORLD ARCHERY CONGRESS BELEK ANTALYA (TUR) – 27-28 September 2013 MINUTES

### SESSION 1 – FRIDAY, 27 SEPTEMBER 2013

Session starts at 9.00

#### 1. OPENING OF CONGRESS

The President opens the 50<sup>th</sup> Congress and expresses the hope for a productive Congress and thanks the attendees for their participation, especially IOC members Mr Habib MACKI, Mr Melitón SÁNCHEZ RIVAS, and Mr Sergey BUBKA.

He invites to the podium Mr Husnu KOCAOGLU President of the Organising Committee of the World Archery Championships. Mr Kocaoglu welcomes the delegates in Belek, Antalya and wishes for a successful Congress.

The President opened the session and welcomed the delegates.

#### 5. NOMINATIONS OF SCRUTINEERS – VOTING PROCEDURE

Congress appointed Ms Evelyn PAPADOPOULOU (GRE) and Mr Cenneth AHLUND (SWE) as scrutineers.

##### **Voting Procedure:**

All votes will be by electronic voting unless mentioned otherwise. A test was made to see if the voting system worked and Congress Delegates did not object to the use of the system which is in conformity with the World Archery Constitution.

#### 6. AFFILIATIONS

##### **6.1 New Members**

The following countries are proposed for acceptance as full members of World Archery:

- Falkland Islands
- Malawi
- Virgin Islands



- Comoros

ARG raised an objection to accept the Falkland Islands and recommends the delegates not to accept them as a World Archery Member Association. GBR supports the acceptance of Falkland Islands as a new full member.

A separate vote is taken on each proposed new member and all members are accepted by a majority of the delegates.

In the case of the following Member Associations, a vote is taken place to reinstate them as World Archery members:

- Kirgizstan
- Kiribati
- Nigeria
- Pakistan
- Togo (For Togo the Secretary General informs under point 6.2 that noticeable activity is required otherwise their membership will be suspended by the Executive Board and they will be expelled at the next Congress.)
- FYRO Macedonia

They also were given the right to vote following their reinstatement.

## 6.2 Exclusion of Non-financial Members

Some of the Member Associations have been inactive or have not been paying World Archery their membership fees for 2012 and/or 2013. After investigation, World Archery proposes that the following countries be issued a final warning. Congress agreed that if within the following two years there is no clear sign of activity, these members will be proposed for expulsion in 2015. The vote is made "en bloc" for the four countries involved to issue a warning:

- Cambodia, Bosnia Herzegovina, Tunisia, and Norfolk Islands

The following Member Associations are expelled of World Archery following an individual vote for non-activity and/or non-payment of World Archery membership fees for several years, after having received a final warning in 2011 congress.

- Afghanistan
- Dominica
- Eritrea
- Mauritania
- American Samoa

At the end of these votes World Archery has 150 Member Associations.

## 9. REPORTS

### 9.1 President's Report

My Dear Friends,

Once again we have come together in a very warm and friendly atmosphere in beautiful Belek. I would like to inform you about some of our important activities very briefly.

As you know very well, we had a great success at the London Games last year in our very prestigious venue at Lords. More than 30 of our matches ended in a shoot-off, a result of our new competition system. I am very happy and proud that many very well-known TV people are saying that archery has changed a lot for TV. In addition, our spectators in London very much liked seeing archery at Lords and according to the Spectators' Satisfaction Survey, which was arranged by the IOC, the general satisfaction level was at 92%, a very high result. I also received many very good comments from NBC Olympics and CBC Sports about archery. And our great sport was shown as a very good example of a changing sport by OBS. Many of my colleagues from the IOC visited us at Lords and commented very positively about our new system. As we all know, this huge improvement was a result of our very dynamic World Archery Plan. This success belongs to all of you, because many of you contributed to the plan and always supported us in all new projects. On behalf of World Archery, I thank you very much.

As a result of the London feedback and the IOC questionnaires and other objective evaluations, archery moved up in the IOC Olympic Revenue distribution categories and World Archery has a very strong position in the Olympic Programme. Archery is now one of the 25 core sports on the programme.

Archery's success was made possible due to the following key elements:

- A great family of skilled, clean, elite athletes from all five continents,
- A set of rules and competition formats that the general public –*not just the archery family*– can easily understand and that can be implemented by our judges and officials,
- A commitment from all of our Member Associations and officials to deliver quality events and development programs,
- A staff that is highly motivated and is ready to take new directions before anyone else, as evidenced in our event production, broadcasting, internet and social media activities,
- A great cooperation with all the stakeholders in the Olympic movement, such as the IOC, ASOIF, ANOC, Olympic Solidarity, WADA, SportAccord and others.



As you know, it was the main goal of our Archery World Plan for archery to become an important Olympic Sport and I can report to you that World Archery has achieved the goal it set for itself.

Our sponsorship programme continues very successful and this year FILA, a high quality sportswear brand, joined us with a long-term contract. I would like to welcome FILA to World Archery and thank them for their support. I believe that FILA will contribute very attractive sports attire to World Archery.

With their high quality preparation and printing, World Archery publications are very much of interest to everyone. As you know, our well-experienced team works very hard at these projects, and Marcos Lorenzo, as a new young person, joined the team with his new energy. At this time, I would like to thank our great team: Bob Smith, Uğur Korkmaz and Hakan Balcı for their great effort.

World Archery TV is also continuing its successful broadcasting and they serve many TV channels with high quality HD images. This year we have a special TV project, the result of which is an agreement with the Eurosport Channel. You will watch archery on Eurosport with increasing broadcast frequency. I thank Cedric Roger and all his Archery TV Team members for their fantastic job.

As you very well know, our World Cup series is continuing with great success and with our archers' great interest. We had another attractive final in Paris in another spectacular location: the Trocadéro last weekend.

As we informed you in general before, World Archery has a big project with the start of the Archery Training Centre construction in Lausanne within the next year. We believe that it will be another big opportunity for improvement for our great sport and this project will serve as a training and competition base for all our archers.

Our family is growing continuously and today we have 156 Member Associations. We are a large family now and we have excellent global representation. We are very happy and proud of this growth. This is also a result of our World Archery Plan.

In the last part of my speech, I want to express my special thanks to my colleagues on our Executive Board. We have a really very good team working in wonderful harmony.

Our Secretary General, Tom Dielen, is like a famous orchestra conductor coordinating the many aspects of World Archery activities. I am very happy to work with him and I thank him very much.

Juan Carlos Holgado, as the chief of the event team, has travelled many, many kilometres and did a great job together with his fantastic team: Chris March, George Tekmitchov, Rocky Bester, Murat Olgun and many others. I would like to thank all of them.

And Pascal Colmaire, Didier Miéville, Caroline Murat, Deqa Niamkey, Ludivine Maitre Wicki, Severine Deriaz, Jenny Brugger, Raheleh Ahadpour, Vanahe Antille, Thomas Aubert, and KIM Soo Nyung I thank all of you for your great efforts and contributions to our wonderful sport.

And I also thank all our committees for their work. Without their involvement we would not have been able to move forward.

And finally, a huge thanks to all of you.

## 9.2 Secretary General's Report including the Ad Hoc Committees Reports

The Secretary General made some additional remarks on his report that was submitted as part of the Congress documents.

- In relation to the IOC and the IOC Session in BA, he reports that the mixed team event was submitted for inclusion in Rio 2016, but the answer is negative at this moment. This is not in relation to the quality of the mixed team event, but the challenges the IOC is currently facing with Rio and all request (17 International Federations) have been put on hold, so there will be no changes for the Rio Games.
- We are pleased to see progress in the membership of our Member Associations. France has passed 70,000 members, and now counts 72,500 members (25% increase since 2008). Archery GB has reached 40,000 (27% increase since 2008). The Archery Trade Association made a study on the US which shows that 18.9 million adults used a bow and arrow last year (of which 38% were women) and the majority was in Target Archery.
- World Archery changed its financial institution since last Congress. The challenge since last congress has been the currency exchange and the conversion from USD to CHF was made at an appropriate time when receiving the IOC income from the Olympic Games 2012.
- Two new staff were hired since last Congress: Chris Marsh (Events Manager) and Marcos Lorenzo (Communication Manager). They were hired in order to increase our services during events and to assist our Member Associations.
- IOC criteria for Revenue distribution: It is important that every Member Association organise a National Championship every year, for both men and women. And inform World Archery of such a championship. This will become a requirement for membership.
- Archery TV, our YouTube channel, has seen an important increase from 8,000 subscribers in 2011 to 27,000 in 2013. We are the number 2 international sports federation on YouTube. Based on Google stats, we have a 68% increase compared to last year.
- Facebook now reached 67,000 fans, 857% growth since last Congress, and the number is rising every day, we target 100,000 by the end of the year 2013.
- We had an average of 10,000 visits per day in 2013 on our website page.
- During the World Games, 3300 tickets were sold for the Compound event making it the biggest audience ever for this discipline.

- The construction of World Archery centre in Lausanne will, hopefully, begin next year, to be finished in 2015.
- At the end of this year, a Strategic Plan Ad-hoc Committee for Member Associations will be appointed.

### 9.3 FIDTA – Report

The Secretary General informs Congress on the activities of the International Foundation for the Development of Archery (FIDTA). FIDTA is funded primarily by revenue from the interest generated by the capital of the foundation, and therefore only runs projects where other partners are involved, such as Olympic Solidarity, Easton Sports Foundation, Global Sport development, etc.

In 2012, FIDTA's activities were only related to funding the World Archery Centre in Lausanne, and all expenses in 2013 are going the development of this centre, with the help of the Easton Sports Foundations. The construction of the centre will not impact the finances of World Archery.

## 10. FINANCES

### 10.1 Finance and Audit Board Report 2011 and 2012

The Secretary General presented the Financial Statements of 2011 and 2012. They have been audited by Price Waterhouse Coopers. No questions are raised on the Finance and Audit Board reports.

### 10.2 2011 Audited Accounts / Auditor's Report

The Accounts and Auditor's Report for 2011 are approved by Congress by raise of hands.

### 10.3 2012 Audited Accounts / Auditor's Report

The Accounts and Auditor's Report for 2012 are approved by Congress by raise of hands.

### 10.4 Financial Programme 2013-2017

The reserves at the end of 2012 were 13 million CHF, this figure is higher than the expectation which was 11.9 million CHF. The reasons are that we did not spent as much as we budgeted, and that IOC revenues were higher (518 million USD distributed to all sports). Our part was also higher than expected, as we budgeted 12 million USD and we received about 15 million USD.

Budgeted revenues for 2013 are 2.4 million CHF. The Executive Board has decided that the additional payments from the IOC will be used to pay off the mortgage of our office, so we do not have any mortgage left. This will be done at the end of the year to avoid paying penalties.

At the end of 2013 we should have 9 million CHF in reserve, which will be used the next 3 years to cover development, events expenses as well as other projects.

The expected Olympic revenue for 2016 is about 14.5 million CHF based on the actual currency exchange rate between USD and CHF. We cannot expect a higher income even if archery will move up to next group of sports. 2012 was exceptional as the Olympic programme had only 26 sports instead of 28.

#### 10.4 Member Association fees

WA's proposal is to change the currency of the base membership fees from USD to CHF, because all of our accounting is in CHF. The change has been approved unanimously.

#### 10.5 Approval of the Auditors Firm

It is proposed to keep Price Waterhouse Coopers as our auditor firm.

The firm Price Waterhouse Coopers is approved by Congress by raise of hands.

### 11. INTERPRETATIONS

Since no questions were raised in relation to the interpretations they are submitted for approval to Congress "en bloc".

The submitted interpretations are approved by Congress by vote.

## 17. MOTIONS & PROPOSALS FOR LAWS

There are twelve motions.

Below are the comments or questions that were raised:



### Motion 1

#### Article 1.4.2.4

The insertion of an article about Autonomy of Sports.

Voting on Motion 1: (97 voting delegates, 92 Yes, 2 No, 1 Abstention, 2 did not vote) Passed

IND thanks World Archery for supporting the Indian Archery Association which faced autonomy issues the last year.

### Motion 2

#### Article 1.4.4

Free choice of Continental Association. Executive Board discussed this motion, which may raise problems with Qualifications rules to the Olympic Games and Youth Olympic Games, and also with funding and support from Continental Olympic Committees. The presenter of the motion was not present.

Voting on Motion 2: (96 voting delegates, 32 Yes, 54 No, 9 Abstention, 1 did not vote) Rejected.

### Motion 3

#### Article 1.4.4

Creation of a new World Archery Continental Association. BAN raises the fact that Lebanon is not here to explain their motions. CIV defends Lebanon position as they face political issues, and also that Lebanon was member of Europe and Mediterranean Archery Union since the creation, and when the organisation changed, only Israel remained as an EMAU Member in the region. Secretary General highlights that the remarks concerning Motion 2 are relevant here. GRE regrets that countries which may be affected by this proposal were not contacted beforehand.

Voting on Motion 3: (93 voting delegates, 9 Yes, 81 No, 2 Abstention, 1 did not vote) Rejected.

### Motion 4

Article 1.16.1 and other Articles where the name "The Field Archery Committee" appears.

Change the name of "The Field Archery Committee" to "The Field and 3D Archery Committee"

Voting on Motion 4: (95 voting delegates, 79 Yes, 7 No, 5 abstention, 4 did not vote) Passed

### Motion 5

#### Article 3.18.1

Change of format for Qualification rounds at World Archery Championships from a FITA Round (subsequently called the "1440 Round") to a 70m Round.

The Secretary General points out that this motion will only impact World Archery Championships. The Continental Associations and the Member Associations will determine the format they use for their tournaments. The FITA Round will remain as a World Archery discipline, and will be kept in the Constitution & Rules.

The delegate of NZL informs Congress that they fought many years to keep the FITA Round at World Championships. However since the Compound Round has been changed to 50m Round, it is fair to have recurve athletes shoot the same number of arrows. Therefore NZL supports the motion.

The President raises the fact that Archery needs to be more and more dynamic. It is also a part of the World Plan, and the motion is supported by the Athletes Committee and the Organisers.

After another question from ITA, and a confirmation by the Secretary General that Continental Associations have the right to use other formats for the qualification round, the matter is voted upon.

Voting on Motion 5: (96 voting delegates, 79 Yes, 13 No, 4 abstention) Passed

Ms Carole Hicks, as technical delegate for the World Archery Para Championships to be held in Bangkok this November, requests that this new law comes into effect for this Championship. The Secretary General asks Congress for permission to make the effective date for this motion to be 1<sup>st</sup> November and to use 70m Round as qualification round for this Championship. The request is accepted by a raise of hands.

#### Motion 6

Article 3.18.1, 4.5.1.2, 4.5.1.3, 4.5.1.8, 4.7.2, 5.3.1, 6.3.3, 6.4, 12.1.1 and 12.1.2

Change the name of "FITA Round" to "1440 Round"

Change the name of "Double FITA Round" to "Double 1440 Round"

Voting on Motion 6: (96 voting delegates, 78 Yes, 17 No, 1 abstention) Passed.

#### Motion 7 & Amendment

Article 4.4

Change the categories for Para-Archery to have an Open Recurve, Open W1 and rename "Recurve IPC" to "Para Recurve" and "Compound IPC" to "Para Compound"

Voting on Motion 7 and Amendment: (97 voting delegates, 89 Yes, 5 No, 3 abstention) Passed.

#### Motion 8

Article 4.5.1.4 and 14.1.5

Set system for Recurve Team Elimination rounds.

Voting on Motion 8: (95 voting delegates, 90 Yes, 5 No, 0 abstention) Passed

#### Motion 9

Article 4.5.1.8, 6.3.3

Remove Half FITA Round.

CIV raises the question on why removing it instead of moving it to Book 5.

Secretary General mentioned that the motion was proposed since few tournaments of this type are organised.

CUB mentioned that the last Half FITA Round shot in international competition was in 1990.

Voting on Motion 9: (96 voting delegates, 73 Yes, 17 No, 5 abstention) Passed

#### Motion 10

Article 4.5.2.4, 4.7.3, 5.3.1.2, 14.1.5 and 14.1.6

Cumulative scoring for Indoor Compound rounds.

Voting on Motion 10: (94 voting delegates, 86 Yes, 4 No, 3 abstention) Passed

#### Motion 11 & Amendment

Article 6.3.2 and 6.3.4

Change Awards name.



Voting on Motion 11 and Amendment: (95 voting delegates, 91 Yes, 4 No, 0 abstention) Passed

#### Motion 12

Article 27.3.1

Ties in Field and 3D Rounds.

Voting on Motion 12: (93 voting delegates, 84 Yes, 4 No, 3 abstention, 2 did not vote) Passed

With the exception of Motion 5, only for World Archery Para Championships in Bangkok, all these changes will come into effect on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2014.

### **15. WORLD ARCHERY PLAN**

The Secretary General informs Congress about the current state of the World Archery Plan.

The vision for this World Archery Plan was that Archery is recognised as an important Olympic sport. World Archery Plan was a project of change and regeneration of the sport of Archery, it was initiated in 2007 with the aim to increase international recognition of archery. The project was based on improving the Olympic position of Archery. In this regards, World Archery plan is clearly a success.

The World Archery brand is one of the most visible results of the World Archery Plan, spread to the Continental Associations and more and more to Member Associations. Archery events are now more athlete, TV, media and fan friendly. The number of international sponsors has increased.

According to a survey led by World Archery in June 2012, among 85 independent experts from the world of sports, 61% agreed that over the last five years World Archery has indeed increased its importance as an Olympic sport. The other indicator is that Archery has moved up in IOC grouping of sports.

The Secretary General also introduces the next step of the World Archery Plan 2013-2017. It is now up to Member Associations to make their own breakthroughs. The focus for the next step of the Plan is on Member Associations, helped by World Archery, in order to make Archery an important sport in each country. World Archery will offer its support in terms of Events, Partnerships, Management, Development and Promotion.

Member Associations will have to develop their own strategy, and for this, World Archery will provide support.

The Secretary General introduces the workshops to be held during the Congress: events organisation and presentation, social media, strategic planning, and development.

### **21. WORLD ARCHERY EVENTS**

- **Tokyo Olympic Games 2020**

The Secretary General invites Mr Masatoshi SEKI to present the report of the Tokyo 2020

Olympic Games. The Presentation starts by the video presented during host city election in 125<sup>th</sup> IOC Session in Buenos Aires. Para-archery will be held at the same place that the Olympics will be held.

- **2013 World Para-Archery Championships in Bangkok (THA) / 1-7 Nov 2013**

Mr Charnvit MUNIKANOND, member of the Organising Committee gave a presentation on the progress of the organisation of the 2013 World Para-Archery Championships.

Thailand is ready. 31 countries are currently registered for the event.

- **2015 World Para-Archery Championships in Donaueschingen (GER) / 25-30 Aug 2015**

Mr Juergen LOECHELT, member of the Organising Committee, gave a presentation of the organisation of the 2015 World Para-Archery Championships.

The Challenge was to find a unique location, to offer something different, something new. Donaueschingen is a small town located at 30 km of Swiss border, near lake of Konstanz and Zürich, and Stuttgart airports. Main stand (2800 seats) of the competition field will be able to accommodate all the offices, and administration. Each of the three fields will host 35 to 40 targets.

- **2013 World Archery 3D Championships in Sassari (ITA) / 8-12 Oct 2013**

No formal presentation was given but the Secretary General informed Congress that there will be a good participation.

- **2013 World Archery Youth Championships in Wuxi (CHN) / 13-20 Oct 2013**

This Championship will be the main qualifier for Nanjing 2014 Youth Olympic Games, located one hour driving from Wuxi. The qualification system will be explained to delegations during the World Championship in Antalya.

- **Nanjing 2014 Youth Olympic Games**

The Secretary General gives a short update on the preparations on behalf of the Organising Committee. The preparation of the YOG are going well, archery will take place in the permanent Nanjing archery facility. World Archery wanted another venue but this was not possible.

- **World Archery Field Championship 2014**

World Archery is awaiting candidatures for this Championship. Croatia is willing to organise it. However. If other countries are interested for 2014 or 2016, they need to apply to World Archery.

- **2015 World Archery Championships in Copenhagen (DEN) / 24 July-2 Aug 2015**

Mr Rolf LIND, member of the Organising Committee gave a presentation on the progress of the organisation of the 2015 World Archery Championships.



The competition field will be very close to the hotels and the airport. The finals will be in the city that is 2 minutes away from the 2009 World Cup Final's venue. Transportation from airport to hotel will be about 10 minutes. Shuttles will be organized all day long, every 30 minutes between hotels and venue. Hotels are located at 10 minutes by metro from the town center.

CGF is conducting a study on the way they select sport for the future, study is still taking place.

### **16.2 Presentation on cooperation with International Field Archery Association (IFAA)**

Some ideas presented in Torino are advancing while others are put on hold. World Archery would like to organise with IFAA a worldwide archery day next year.

### **16.3 Presentation on cooperation with Fédération Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU)**

World Archery is finalizing an agreement with FISU.

The World Archery University Championship that were planned to be held in Louvain-la-Neuve (BEL) have been cancelled. The Belgian University Sport Federation is unable to organise it, and World Archery is assisting FISU for finding a new organiser. Discussions have started with the Polish University Sport Federation, and they could organise the championship just after or before Wroclaw Archery World Cup.

In 2016, the last World University Championship will be held because Archery is now a permanent sport of the Universiade (next one will be in Korea, and then Chinese Taipei).
