Field Archery - New regulations

The members of the Ad Hoc Committee for the Revision of the Regulations for Field Archery, elected during the Congress in Adelaide in March 1987, have continued their work by correspondence after one meeting in June in Bolzano.

The members of the Committee have returned the questionnaire which had been given to them to the Chairman of the Committee, FITA Vice-President Nikola Skoric. Taking these into account, the latter is currently drafting a coherent text in the form of regulations, which will be able to be transformed into a motion by the Council.

The Yugoslavian Federation has generously offered to organize an experimental tournament to try out the proposed regulations one week before the World Championship in Bolzano. This tournament will take place from 26th to 29th May 1988 in the natural park of Trakoscan, situated in the North-West of Croatia along the main road leading from Zagreb to Maribor.

The second form of cooperation is in supplying us with the lists of addresses of the people Member Associations wish to receive the Bulletin in their country; Member Associations only can tell us who can most benefit or can best help Archery there by becoming one of our Readers. So please remember to send us an updated list for 1988.

1988 will be a very important year, not only because it is an Olympic year but also because the new Rules for Field Archery will be drafted and examined by the Council in view of 1989 Congress; the FITA Standard bow will be patented and we plan to hold in cooperation with UIPMB some trials of Ski-ARC, the new discipline combining Archery with cross country skiing.

As you see it is a rich menu on which to celebrate the new year. Let me toast with you all to a very successful 1988, for Archers and friends of Archery throughout the world.

Field archery: the XIth world championship and the IXth European championship will take place in Italy



From 26th May to 6th June 1988, the best field archers will compete on the *San Genesio* circuit at an altitude of 1087 m and 10 km from *Bolzano*, the capital of the Southern Tyrol situated at the junction of the Adige and Isarco valleys.

In the name of the Italian Archery Federation, the FITARCO, *Gerda Delladio Lorenz* will chair the *Organizing Committee*, constituted principally by officers of the "Compagnia Arcieri Bolzano Merano", a club of which she is the President. This Archery Club has organized the "Owl Trophy" for eleven years to everyone's satisfaction. The experience thus achieved should ensure the success of the forthcoming World Championship, the programme of which is as follows:

- *Sunday, 29th May:* arrival of the delegations and accreditation
- *Monday 30th and Tuesday 31st May:* free for training
- *Wednesday, 1st June:* official training in Bolzano; inspection of equipment and opening ceremony
- *Thursday, 2nd June:* first day of competition
- *Friday, 3rd June:* rest day
- *Saturday, 3th June:* second day of competition; presentation of awards and closing ceremony
- *Sunday, 5th June:* closing banquet
- *Monday, 6th June:* departure of delegations.

In Bolzano

The delegations will be lodged in Bolzano. The archers will be able to train there. The opening ceremony and the closing banquet will take place there. The town is well served by road and rail. The Bolzano train station is on the international Intercity railway line Munich-Verona. The nearest airports are Innsbruck (125 km), Venice (250 km), Milan and Munich (300 km).

In San Genesio

The competitions (2nd and 4th June) and the closing ceremony will take place there. Another training ground together with field targets will be installed there.

Devélopment and Technical Assistance



Don Mc Leish and Keith Gaisford, the Australian experts in FITA training and administration, in the company of the course participants, on the very day the Solomon Islands Archery Association was created, the 2nd July 1987, in Honiara.

The flight to and from Honiara, apart from a long delay at our departure and freight problems, was quite comfortable.

Upon our arrival, we found that the equipment had been removed from the aircraft before departure, thus remaining in Brisbane. We made the necessary arrangements to ensure that the equipment would arrive on the following flight. Our programme had to be rearranged. On Thursday, a driver was sent to the airport to collect the equipment, only to be told that the cargo had once more been unloaded by the airline in order to make place space for some machinery. It was now going to be impossible to give practical lessons. It is difficult to describe the feelings that Keith and I had on hearing these news. The course organizers and participants were very gracious, considering the circumstances. Thirty enthusiastic Solomon Islanders participated in the course, with a daily attendance of 100%. Their interest in all the sessions was steadfast, and the videos and slides were particularly popular; they were viewed as often as possible. Due to circumstances, these visual examples illustrated the theory of shooting, and replaced the practical sessions made impossible because the lack of equipment. The practical sessions took place on the grassy playing area of the Honiara High School. Accomodations were first class; the vehicle provided for our use was very much appreciated. The Mendona Hotel was only about a five minute drive from the course center, and was situated right by the sea. The comfortable surroundings, the meals and the entertainment provided were excellent.

Obviously, there was a necessary step to be taken during the course of the seminar, i.e. the creation of an organization of archers which would ensure the continuity of our work following our departure. After having unveiled all the necessary theory, the Solomon Islands Archery Association was formed. All agreed to the concept of a national association; and with purely advisory assistance from Keith and myself, the course participants conducted elections and a basic committee was formed. The following people were thus elected to the executive positions within the newly formed organization:

President: Brown Saua

Vice-President: John Tepepe

Secretary: Bart Basia

Treasurer: William Lui

Members: Lency Tomoko, Thomas Sapivaka, Oliver Ossi, Jackson Mebu and Lionel Nuboa.

These officials were offered support from the Australian Archery Association, the FITA, and the DTAC.

With further assistance, I am confident that this new association will, in the not too distance future, be ready to make a membership application to the FITA.

We owe a debt of thanks to Olympic Solidarity for making this course possible. I would also like to thak FITA, in particular its DTAC, Stan Patterson, for his encouragement and course material. I also thank those thirty enthusiastic and patient men who sat throgh some heavy theoretical sessions and came out smiling, even though they never set eyes on the very object of the entire seminar, the modern target archery bow and arrow.

Solomon Islands' Olympic Solidarity mission Technical assistance course Monday 29th June - Sunday 5th July, 1987

Following approximately five months of preparation involving hundreds of hours of work, long distance telephone calls and telexes, the Solomon Islands Archery Technical Course was held in Honiara, capital of the Solomon Islands. This archery technical course was granted to the Solomon Islands National Olympic Committee by Olympic Solidarity, so as to introduce archery into this region. FITA became involved in it through the intermediary of its Development and Technical Assistance Committee (DTAC) and its Chairman, Jim Easton. Although only a partner in this adventure, FITA endeavoured, through this committee, to assist the Solomon Islands NOC in its attempt to seriously integrate itself into the archery family.

XXIst GAISF Congress and General Assembly

The President, Francesco Gnegchi-Ruscione, and James L. Easton, represented FITA during the Congress and General Assembly of the General Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF), chaired by Dr. Un Yong Kim, from 15th to 17th October 1987 in Colorado Springs (USA).

For the last three years, the GAISF Congresses have been centred on a single theme. "Education and Sport" was the subject this year. Twenty-three speakers, coming from very varied backgrounds of both sport and teaching, presented the different facets of a subject which is difficult but essential to the healthy growth of the sports movement at all levels. James L. Easton, Chairman of the FITA Development and Technical Assistance Committee, was one of these speakers. His contribution was greatly appreciated. All the speeches will be published in a manual which GAISF will distribute to the Federations who request it from the GAISF Secretariat, (7 Boulevard de Suisse, Monte-Carlo, MC 98000 Monaco).

The next annual meeting of GAISF will take place from the 3rd to the 5th November 1988 in Lausanne.

To develop our Sport and assist its growth is the most impressive task FITA has ever undertaken. Judging by the efficient transfer of knowledge and experience which was in full play during the 3rd Development and Technical Assistance Committee's workshop held in Novi Vinodolski, the positive echoes of this task will certainly be far-reaching. The workshop enabled the participants from eight countries (BEL, BUL, GRE, POL, TCH, TUR, USA and YUG) to enrich their own experience by exchanging various even diametrically opposed ideas originating from, as Raoul Theeuwes – the FITA expert in charge of the workshop – said: "more than 300 years of experience in Archery".

With the help of Raoul Theeuwes and Don S. Rabska, FITA experts and with that of International lecturers Rick Mc Kinney and Jay Barrs and also of National lecturer Prof. Dr. George Nemanic, Alexander Milinkovic and Alois Mauser various subjects were under discussion. Some were covered thoroughly while other issues were just outlined and left for further elaboration at the next two stages.

The theoretical classes including the promotion of archery a general organization and management, instruction and analysis of shooting, organization of tournaments and competition rules, selection, trimming and tuning of equipment. The practical exercises were crowned with quite a thrilling experience for the competitors and the organizers alike: the Grand FITA Round Team Event. What a surprise for all to hear the frenetic cheerings of the ex-bystanders! The promotional role of coaches was headlined by Nikola Skoric Vice President of FITA, addressing the participants the message of our International Federation: "FITA counts on you!" Indeed, every coach should be involved in promoting his or her sport, so, dear toxophilite, do not hesitate to ask any participant at the FITA coaching courses to help you in your archery endeavours but, please, also ask yourself what you have been doing so that Archery stands side by side with other Olympic sports. Each effort on your part is worth while. Archery deserves more. We know that. But let us convince other people of it.

Thanks to the FITA Development and Technical Assistance Committee courses, the seeds of coaching will be sown in many lands. Nobody expects them to bear fruit before they grow and yet in many existing and future archery clubs the coaching practice based upon the long-term programmes and the team work will steadily result in such achievements that will feedback the further promotion of Archery all over the world.

The members of the Yugoslavian Archery Federation did their best to host the course (warm welcome, opening ceremony featuring colourful local folk dances and music, evening social activities, the closing ceremony etc.).

Last but not least, the archers from eight countries have tightened the new "strings" of the FITA ever strengthening bow of friendship!

Mrs. Flor Isava Fonseca, member of the International Olympic Committee in Venezuela, received the FITA Silver Medal from the hands of the President Francesco Gnegchi-Ruscone during the Panamerican Games at Indianapolis. This award was decided by the 1987 Congress in recognition of her activity in favour of the promotion of archery in South America. Four other medals were distributed this year. Three in gold for Nikola Skoric, FITA Vice-President and Chief Editor of our Bulletin, for his thirty years of faithful service to FITA, and for Ovid Gorchakov and Georgy Gordienko, both from the Archery Federation of the USSR, for their efficiency as FITA officials and as organizers of top competitions; and one in silver for Mr & Mrs Miller, in charge of "The World Archery Center", an American school which has become the centre of promotion of our sport in many countries.
