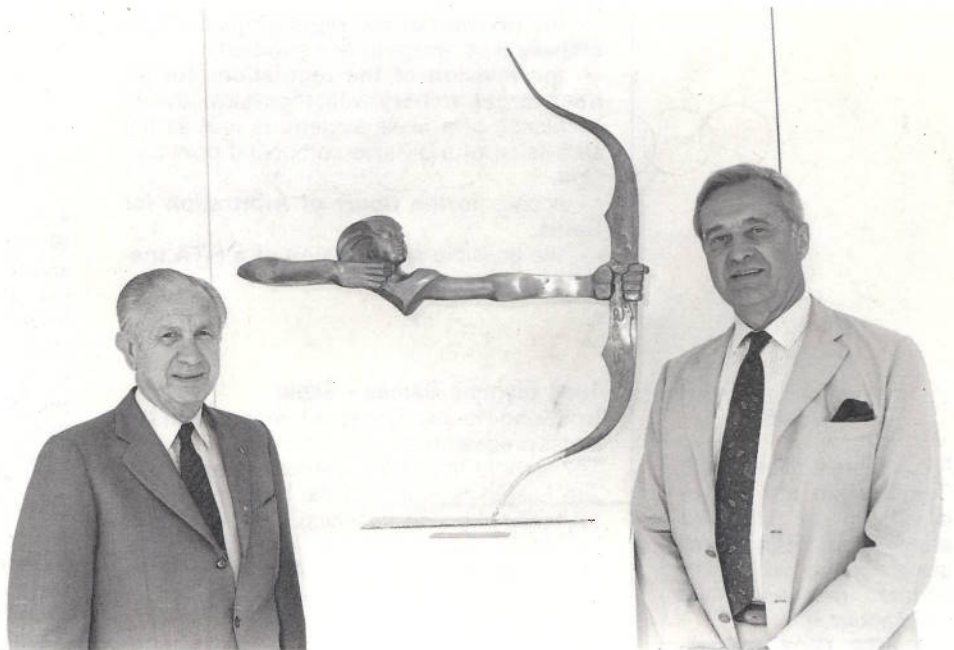

Editorial

In this summer of 1988 FITA Archers meet two challenges of extraordinary importance: the World Championships in Field Archery of Bolzano and the Olympic Tournament of Seoul. Of the first, that took place with great success of organisation, participation and results, this issue of the Bulletin gives all the information.

I shall only add that the occasion was made even more important by the meeting in Bolzano of FITA Council to discuss the draft for the revision of Field Archery Rules that had been prepared by the ad-hoc Work Group. Following closely the experimental tournament of Trakoscan the Council could progress rapidly and in depth towards defining the motions that will be presented to the 1989 Congress.

The Olympic Tournament beginning at the Hwarang Archery Field on the morning of the 27th of September has already given us a great satisfaction: preliminary entries have reached the record number of 197 Archers from 44 National Olympic Committees.

We sincerely hope that a very high proportion of them will be re-confirmed in the final entries by name.

It would be the best possible way to honour the Olympic Games in a country where Archery enjoys such popularity and success.

These top-level events however must not let us forget the other side of FITA's life, at least as important, that of the promotion and development of our Sport.

While new affiliations are being processed, the Standard Bow project is advancing and I am particularly pleased to announce that before the end of the year FITA can issue to requesting Member Associations all the technical documents, blueprints and manufacturing manual that will enable them to proceed in practice.

Already several member Associations have requested the rights of production.

A promotional brochure is also being prepared and we hope to be able to distribute at the Olympic gathering in Seoul where many National Olympic Committees that do not yet have a FITA Member Association will be invited to attend our Tournament and become acquainted with our Sport.

Publications

A complete edition of the **Constitution and Regulations** will be published after each FITA Congress, during which important motions have been adopted.

The **FITA Glossary** edited by Vice-President Stan Patterson (GBR) will serve as a basis for the edition of the FITA documents.

Meeting of the FITA Council at Bolzano

The members of the FITA Council met on **3 and 5 June 1988** on the occasion of the field archery world championships. We present briefly their main decisions or recommendations.

Balance and plans

The audited accounts for 1987 were approved. The programme of activities and the financial projects for 1988 were presented by the Treasurer.

Records

— the **team records of the world championships** will from now on be established according to the total achieved either in the semi-finals or the finals of the Grand FITA Round for teams (3 × 36 arrows).

— the **records of the junior championships** will be given out by the Executive Committee.

Doping control

The list of forbidden substances proposed by the Medical Committee in accordance with the IOC list was adopted.

Development and technical assistance

The report of the Development and Technical Assistance Committee on the project of a **standard bow** was studied. A prototype of this type of bow was presented.

The possibility of creating **FITA Development Centres** was envisaged.

Preparation for the 1989 Congress

Motions to be submitted to the 1989 Congress were studied. They refer to:

— the **revision of the regulations for field archery** (see article in this number);

— the **revision of the regulations for indoor target archery** with, if possible, the introduction of a finals system as well as the admission of a division compound bow division.

— access to the **Court of Arbitration for Sport**.

— the possible **suppression of a FITA match by correspondence**.

1988 Olympic Games - Seoul

Um Sung-Ho and Chang H.I. reported on the latest preparations.

197 archers from 44 countries are expected. Jim Easton reported on the preparation of a technical film, the financing of which would be assured by the "Archery Goods Manufacturers" and the "Easton Aluminium Company".

1989 World Games - Karlsruhe

A qualification system still has to be drawn up in agreement with the International World Games Association.

Attribution of championships

The **Greek Archery Association** will organize the **IVth Indoor Target Championships of Europe and Mediterranean** probably in December 1989.

The **Royal Spanish Archery Federation** will present the **XIth Outdoor Target Championships of Europe and Mediterranean** in 1990 in **Barcelona**. This tournament will act as a dress rehearsal for the organisers and the delegations in preparation for the Olympic Games two years later.

South East Asian Games

Archery will be on the programme of the next South East Asian Games.

Approval of technical delegates

— **Tang Yip-KAY** (SIN) for the **XVIth South East Asian Games**, in 1989 in Kuala Lumpur (MAL).

— **Ramon LIM** (PHI) for the **XIth Asian Games** in 1990 in **Beijing** (CHN)

— **Don LOVO** (CAN) for the **XIth Panamerican Games** in 1991 in **Havana** (CUB)

— **Don LOVO** (CAN) and **Stan PATTERSON** (GBR) for the **1992 Olympic Games** in **Barcelona**, whilst specifying that the FITA President, **Francesco GNECCHI-RUSCONE** will act as technical delegate **during the period of construction of the site of the competition**.

— **Knud Hammer ANDRESEN** (DEN) for the **Masters Games** planned for 22 July to 6 August 1989 in **Denmark**.

Next meeting

Will take place next January at the headquarters of the International Olympic Committee in Lausanne (SUI).

Before mentioning the technical aspects we must express the sincere appreciation of FITA for the wonderful organisation and warm hospitality that all, competitors, Officials, FITA Council, Media and Spectators have enjoyed.

Mrs. Gerda Lorenz, Chairman of the Organizing Committee, was everywhere expressing the best of the Italian Federation's organizing ability that FITA remembers with pleasure from Passariano in 1972 and Punta Ala in 1981.

Everything was helped by the magnificent scenarios of the city of Bolzano for the Opening Ceremony in the main square to the sunny meadows and green pine forests on the slopes of San Genesio with the fantastic background of the Dolomites.



134 Archers from 19 countries took part in the Championships.

All Competitors and Officials expressed their approval for the layout of the courses with targets presenting remarkable shooting difficulties while being reasonably accessible on a demanding mountain course.

The great surprise of the Championships came in the results, in which the traditional domination in this discipline by the Scandinavian and Nordic countries was successfully challenged by archers from around the Alps: Germany, France, Austria and particularly Italy that won five of the eight events.

A beautiful weather was enjoyed right through and a very friendly banquet in a Medieval Tirolean castle was the fitting close of the Championships.

Remarks by Nikola Skoric

These championship were played for the first time in accordance with the Regulations of the Grand FITA Round. The excellent results obtained provide a new proof of the justification of the introduction of this system.

The organizing Association, the Luxemburg Archery Association, proved that a small national association could organize a big tournament with success.

Already at the opening ceremony, with the parade of the participating teams accompanied by Dixiland music, it was possible to foresee something new and friendly. When François de Massary, FITA Vice-President, declared the championship open in blazing sunshine and the flag started to fly, we felt that a great sporting spectacle was about to commence. During the first two days, the qualifying rounds brought many surprises. Yuri Leontiev (URS) revealed his high ambitions by improving the world record at 90 m in gaining 329 points. A fierce battle took place for entry to the final rounds. Perfect shots became more and more numerous. Eight results exceeded 1300 points and almost 100 went past the 1200 mark. To get through to the 1/16th finals, the women had to score more than 1239 points and the men 1266 points!

Yuri Leontiev, new European Champion

Yuri Leontiev came within three points of the FITA world record of Darell Pace in achieving an excellent score of 1338 points. The 1/8, 1/4 and semi-finals were full of personal dramas and sensational reversals of the situation. The men's final was phenomenal whereas Ludmilla Arzhannikova displayed her total feminine supremacy.

The men's final began in a climate of tension. Di Buo (ITA) scored 89 out of a possible 90 points at 30 m beating Nordlander (SWE). Esheev and Leontiev (URS). In the background, everyone could see the bad weather approaching-storm and rain... the wind, already fairly strong, did not bother Leontiev (169). Esheev (168) and did not stop them from getting into the first places. Di Buo (166) was 5th. After the 70 m shooting, Leontiev was still leading (247) but in second place came Dalef Kahlert (FRG) with 254 points followed by Esheev (244) and then Tomy Poikolainen from Finland with 242, 9 decisive arrows at 90 m remained to be shot. Leontiev and Esheev were equal with 317 points they were followed by Pokolainen (FIN) and Zabrotsky (URS) both with 312 points. Shoot-offs had to be organized to designate the first and third.



During the first shoot-off, Leontiev and Esheev, both with 27, stayed equal whereas Poikolainen (24) showed himself better than Zabrotski (21) and won the bronze medal.

In the second shoot-off, Leontiev (27) won the gold medal in beating Esheev (20) who had to be content with the silver medal on this occasion.

In the women's finals, the gold medal went to Arzhannikova (311), the silver to Claudia Kriz (FRG) with 4 points less and the bronze to the French woman Catherine Pellen (299).

The team semi-finals and finals were played on the last day under rather bad weather conditions which delayed the start of the semi-finals. Despite these conditions, the twelve teams reaching the semi-finals, both men's and women's shot perfectly.

To get through to the finals the Finns (947) came before the Soviets (946) and the Belgians (946), whereas Holla, Switzerland, Italy and Denmark were eliminated.

In the women's finals, the Soviet Union (953) led France (947) and Sweden (935), whereas Switzerland, Italy, Turkey and Spain had to leave the competition.

For the finals, the weather improved and the visibility of the competition proved a real pleasure. After the 60 m shot, the Soviet Union (795) was leading Finland (772) then France, already third at the last world championships. After the men's 70 m shot, surprise – Finland (610) was in front of Sweden and the Soviet Union. Then came the 9 decisive arrows at 70 m for the women and at 90 m for the men. The Soviet Union women (943) won followed still by Finland (933) and Germany (920). The Soviet archers (960) maintained their domination over Sweden (950) and Finland (948). The solemn announcement of the winners and the presentation of flowers to the best participants took place in beautiful weather. This beautiful event will stay a superb moment in our memory.

After Trakoscan 1988... ...The 1989 Trakoscan Grand Prix

The Castle of Trakoscan (YUG) had never seen so many archers gathered together since 1532, the time when Sultan Suleiman II Kanuni, known as the "Magnificent" devastated our lands retreating from Vienna, where he had been defeated by Nikola Jurisek near Kisek, Suleiman had come with an army of 100,000 soldiers and with 6,000 archers. This year, Turkish archers returned for the first time to take part in the field archery competition on the occasion of the FITA Field Archery Test Tournament at Trakoscan.

They were not the only ones to come to discover competitive field archery: the Soviets, the Greeks, the Poles, the Portuguese, the Bulgarians and the Roumanians also came for the same purpose. Besides them were archers from countries where field archery is a tradition and whose representatives have already won many medals: from Finland, Sweden, Italy, America, Australia, Austria, Great Britain, Germany and from Yugoslavia.

In all, archers from 16 countries on three continents were present, figures which prove the success of the meeting and the importance accorded to it. In addition, the most important FITA representatives were there: Francesco Gnechchi-Ruscione (ITA), the President, Dono Lovo (CAN), First Vice-Presidents, Knud Hammer Andresen (DEN), James Easton (USA), Peter Kliegl (FRG), Don Stamp (GBR), all members of the Council, Leif Janson (SWE), Patrick Monier (FRA) and Klaus Roettger (FRG), members of the ad hoc working group, Fred Gavin, member of the Disciplinary Committee, Don Rabska (USA), member of the Technical Committee, Ivan Misjak (YUG), member of the Target Archery Committee, Zbigniew Dominikowski (POL), Vice-President of the European Archery Union, Mrs. Sigrid Johansson (SWE) and Gianguido Vessi (ITA) international referees, in addition to Mario Kozul, Alojz Mauser and Nenad Slukic, national referees. Amongst the delegations were several well-known archery experts such as Willi Scherubl (AUT), Bob Rhode (USA), Ken Wilsson (AUS), amongst others. Some of them did not hesitate to take part in the competition themselves in order to obtain practical experience of the proposed new regulations. They did not seem at all embarrassed to confront the best archers in the world such as Peder Ax (SWE), Eric Hall (USA), Tim Strickland (USA), Judy Adams (USA), Margaret Gandy (USA), Shirley Strickland (USA), Don Rabska (USA), Claudio Bossi (ITA), Marijan Podrzaj (YUG), Deola Mario (ITA), Jones Cris (GBR), M. Rautavaara (FIN) and others.

What did the test prove?

The debate very efficiently led by the FITA President amongst almost all the participants gave rise to the noting of several suggestions for the future study of the ad hoc working group. The test gave the opportunity of showing what should be changed. In this respect, the test was more than a success. The best proof is that the proposal presented to the FITA Council during the course of its meeting at Bolzano was accepted unanimously.

Our group has thus fulfilled its mission with success.

In addition, the FITA Council accepted that a tournament should be organized at Trakoscan on 24, 25 and 26 June 1989 in accordance with regulations which will be submitted for ratification to the FITA 1989 Congress in Lausanne (SUI).

One can say almost with certainty that this 1989 test will constitute the start of a new era in field archery and that the 1990 world championships, organized in Loen (NOR), will be played according to the new regulations if they are accepted by the congress participants.

In this issue which comes out on the eve of the XXIVth Olympiad in Seoul (KOR), we thought it useful to publish the list of Olympic Gold Medalists.

I. The 1900-1920 period

Archery events were contested at the Olympic Games in 1900, 1904, 1908, and 1920.

In 1900, these events took place during national and international competitions organized on the occasion of the World Exhibition in Paris. 4698 archers were recorded over a period of more than three months. Among the many events in which – besides the French – a few Dutch (six) and numerous Belgians took part, six were considered as Olympic. Here is the list of winners:

«**Berceau**», that is horizontal:

Cordon doré at 33 m: Hubert Van Innis (BEL).

Cordon doré at 50 m: Henri Hérouin son (FRA).

Chapelet at 33 m: Hubert Van Innis (BEL).

Chapelet at 50 m: Eugène Mougins father (FRA).

«**Perche**», aiming at birds fixed at the top of a mast:

Herse: Emmanuel Foulon (FRA).

Pyramide: Emile Grumiaux (FRA).

In 1904, only 23 American archers, including six ladies, participated in five events.

These competitions opposing shooters of just one nationality can be considered only as Olympic demonstration events.

Winners of men's events

Double York Round: Philip Bryant (USA).

Double American Round: Philip Bryant (USA).

Team: Lewis Maxson, Golen Spencer, William Thompson, Robert William (Potomac archers, USA).

Winners of ladies' events

Double National Round and Double Columbia Round: Lida Howell (USA).

Team: Lida Howell, Jessie Pollock, Louise Taylor, Laura Woodruff (USA).

In 1908, three events made up the archery programme, in which 43 British archers, including 18 ladies, 14 French and one American took part.

On the winners' list appear:

York Round (60, 80, 100 yards): William Dod (GBR).

Continental style (50 m, 40 arrows): E. G. Grisot (FRA).

Ladies' National Round (50 et 60 yards): Oveenic Fenton Newall (GBR).

In 1920, 14 Belgian archers, 8 French and 8 Dutch participated.

II. After 1972

Archery was reintroduced to the Olympic programme only in 1972. Since then, the two individual events, one for men and the other for ladies, have been maintained on the Games' programme.
