2nd and 9th July 1989 in Lausanne (SUI): Congress Meeting

Lausanne (SUI) host City of the 35th Outdoor Target World Championship

This Bulletin will be distributed just before the Lausanne Congress.

I hope that many Member Associations will be actively present as a great number of issues vital to the development of our Sport will be discussed.

In the first place Council and some Member Associations are proposing to introduce a new format for the events in the disciplines of Indoor Archery and Field Archery.

These modifications not only aim at making such events consistent with the Grand FITA Round of Target Archery that has proved its success and popularity at last World Championship and Olympic Tournament but also to open the doors of FITA activity to the Archers using Compound

This opening is dangerous for some and overdue for others. I think that the question can be faced by FITA with a serene, matter of fact attitude. Although only a minority of Member Associations are concerned with the use of Compound bows, this type of equipment represents an important part of the membership in some of our most active Member Associations: it would be wrong to neglect these Archers' desire to take part in FITA activity.

We must always however remember that the development of a Sport consists in the improvement of the human skills and moral qualities of the competitors rather than in perfomances enhanced by more sophisticated, more expensive - and therefore accessible to fewer - equipment. This is the substance of the Sports ethics as promoted by the Olympic ideals to which we must always subscribe.

FITA center for the training of coaches

FITA, for the purpose of helping Members Associations in the training of instructors and coaches, is giving patronage to the joint operations of The World Archery Center (TWAC) of Pomfret (USA) and Kielce (POL). This will have an experimental character in 1989 and, if successful, may become a regular annual event.

Based on the experience accumulated by TWAC since 1937, the Kielce course will be open to all European Member Associations and run by experts both from TWAC and specially trained here.

The first session at Kielce will be held in the middle of August.

Meeting of the FITA Council in Lausanne

All the members of the FITA Council were present on **28 and 29 January 1989** for the first meeting of the year in **Lausanne** (SUI), host city to the next open air Target Championships at the beginning of July.

WARM WELCOME OF THE IOC

Thanks to the hospitality of the International Olympic Committee, the meet was able to be held in the spendid premises of the Olympic Building. Even more appreciated was the presence at the Saturday morning session of the President of the IOC, H.E. Mr Juan Antonio Samaranch. He showed his attachment to our Federation and our work, as well as the interest he shows in the evolution of each sport on the Olympic He complimented our Programme. Federation for its positive participation at the Olympic Games in Seoul and also for having succeeded in introducing the Grand FITA Round, which everybody agreed without exception makes the competitions more spectacular. We would also like to thank Raymond Gafner, Administrateur délégué of the IOC, for having hosted our lunch on the Saturday. His toast to the future successes of Archery was appreciated. The FITA President thanked him for his generous hospitality.

STANDARD BOW

This project is drawing to a close. Requests of concession for manufacturing rights can now be accepted. The production manual is ready to be printed. The prototypes of the awards foreseen for competitions were approved. The President confirmed that this new Standard bow was not intended in the short term to replace the Standard bow currently complying with the Rule, unless these rules were modified by a vote in Congress.

MOTIONS FOR THE 1989 CONGRESS

Numerous motions prepared by the Executive Committee and Permanent Committees were studied and approved, sometimes after some changes. Other motions had been transmitted from affiliated Associations and were registered.

LAUSANNE 1989 -TARGET WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Mr. Teddy Bettex, Chairman of the Organizing Committee of the XXXVth Target World Championships, acompanied by Miss Corinne Martin and the representative of the City of Lausanne, Mr Felix, gave a report on the preparations for the big FITA meeting in 1989 (see article appearing in this number).

KARLSRUHE 1989 -WORLD GAMES - FIELD ARCHERY

After the report on the organization the Council approved the nomination of the international judge Klaus Schulz (FRG) as Director of the competition.

SKIARC

A possible target for Skiarc was presented. The launching of this discipline will go ahead, the Council decided, even if other Federations likely to be interested in this innovation had as yet shown little interest. Experimental tournaments had been held in the USA.

WORKING GROUP FOR THE MEDIA AND PROMOTION

A working Group for the media and promotion will be designated by the Council at its next meeting.





The FITA standard bow program


The Standard bow program that the Development and Technical Assistance Committee has started over a year ago following the decision taken by Congress in 1987 is now fully operational.

Its aim is to make available to all Member Associations, whatever their countries' level of technical and economic development, Archery equipment capable of promoting our Sport on a wide basis.

For this FITA has appointed Bill Stewart to prepare not only a completely new design for a low cost bow but also to define all the technology and step by step procedures for

its manufacture.

The blue prints and the manufacturing manual are now ready. It is FITA's intention not to cede the manufacturing rights to manufacturers directly but to grant them to any Member Association that requests it for the purely symbolic royalty of one Swiss Franc.


The Development and Technical Assistance Committee will supply not only these documents but, if necessary, also jigs and templates as well as parts of the bow that may not be available locally.

If necessary, and within the possibility of covering the costs, a manufacturing expert will assist in the starting of production.

It will be up to the Member Associations to find in their country the manufacturers to whom to grant the manufacturing rights and to negotiate with them the contract that will be most advantageous for the develpment of Archery.

In this way all Member Associations may have available not only low cost good quality equipment but also one that, being produced locally, overcomes the too well known difficulty of procuring the currency necessary to import it from other countries.

The Development and Technical Assistance Committee has also completed the Standard Round Award pins, that had been decided by Congress to encourage this form of promotional activity.



As soon as the Championships were entrusted to Lausanne on 26 April 1986, an Organizing Committee was set up under the Chairmanship of Teddy Bettex, President of the Company of Archers of Lausanne; Deputy- Chairmen are Rudolf Dubach, President of the Swiss Archery Association (ASTA), and Jacques Lienhard, Director of Police and Sports of the City of Lausanne.

Within this Committee eight commissions, essentially composed of archers, have worked actively on the preparation of these World Championships. Technicalities, reception-accommodation, publicity, the media... nothing has been left to chance.

Field Archery at the 3rd World Games

The field Archery Committee started very early on to prepare the tournament of the World Games, programmed for 21 to 23 July 1989 in Karlsruhe (FRG).

Competitor's Nomination Forms were sent to all member Associations in October 1988. The replies have been received. Accreditation procedures as proposed by the organizers were accepted.

92 athletes and 7 judges will be allowed on the Field course.

- 36 Women (two competitions: barebow freestyle)
- 56 men (two competitions: barebow freestyle)
- mixed teams (one competition: barebow + freestyle).

The limit for qualification was set very high; well-known champions will be present and the favourites are numerous.

On the preliminary list, there are seven of the twelve medallists from the 1985 World Games in London, as well as the gold medallist from the Olympic Games in Seoul, Jay Barrs (USA), and all the medallists from the last Field Archery World Championships held in Bolzano (ITA) last year.

Judge training seminar procedures

The Judge Committee, at the request of the member Associations, will now prepare an annual list of seminars proposed for the following year. These seminars may be refresher courses for those who are already FITA judges or training courses for future judges.

FITA JUDGE CANDIDATE TRAINING SEMINARS - The Judge Committee will only examine candidates who have served at least two years as a national judge and are recommended by their member Association.

However, at the discretion of the member Association hosting a seminar, and within possibilities, other national judges or other persons concerned may be allowed to follow the seminar as "observers". Several times over the last ten years, our Committee has also included a training and examination programme for national judges, thereby ensuring that they are trained to the same standard as our FIFA Candidate Judges.

THE HOSTING MEMBER ASSOCIATION - Any member Association wishing to organize a training seminar for judges should write to the Chairman of the Judge Committee, with copy to the Secretary General of FITA. A tentative date and location will be studied and if possible a subject will be proposed.

The Judge Committee will then supply a complete list of the necessary requirements, e.g. a meeting room, equipment, overhead projector, etc. The Committee will also propose dates of arrival and departure and instructors will be nominated. Experience has shown that a period of at least six to eight months is necessary to notify potential candidates and for them to make their plans.

Whenever possible, we request the host country to invite neighbouring member Associations to send qualified candidates. The hosting member Association will be responsible for:

a) arranging local accommodation and food for the number of candidates expected

b) arranging local transport and the meeting room as required

c) inviting and advising the applicants directly as to the cost, location, etc.

The hosting member Associations are not expected to bear the cost of the accommodation of their visitors but often do bear the cost of the accommodation of the FITA Instructor(s).

The Chairman of the Judge Committee must receive copies of on all correspondence to and from other Associations to ensure that no problems arise. Official registration for the seminar must be made to the FITA Judge Committee. However, all matters pertaining to arrivals, departure, transportation and accommodation must be handled by the organizing member Association.

A Judges Newsletter will be sent to all Judges and member Associations on a regular basis, listing the locations and the local contact for proposed seminars.

get a personalized reception. A network of transport between the hotels and the Sports Centre has been organized for the participants and the representatives of the media. In addition numerous services such as information, canteen with entertainment, food and drinks, maintenance of material, etc. will all be available at the place of the competitions.

In addition particular importance has been given to the display of the results and of information. This information will be distributed regularly at strategic places such as the stands, the canteen, the administrative offices or the press centre. Wherever you are, you will be able to obtain the latest results!

As far as the media are concerned, they have not been forgotten. A full equipped Press Centre (rooms for the press and telecommunications, areas for interviews, press bar, etc.) has been arranged inside the precincts of the Chavannes Centre. The French-Swiss Radio and Television will give us daily coverage which will be offered to the European organizations through the European Broadcasting Union.

Parallel to the World Championships, FITA will hold its Congress on 2 and 9 July 1989 in the Hotel Movenpick-Radisson, situated on the bank of Lake Geneva at Lausanne-Ouchy.

Lausanne '89 will be a festivity of archery and the number of applications received to date shows that you are numerous in wanting to share it with us. Some 230 are expected on the shooting line at Chavannes.

The Committee and the 200 volunteers who are associated to it will be happy to welcome you very shortly to Lausanne. Have a good trip and... see you soon!
